Communist regimes began to collapse in eastern Europe, and democratic governments rose in East Germany, Poland, Hungary, and Czechoslovakia, followed by the reunification of West and East Germany under NATO auspices. Gorbachev's reforms meanwhile weakened his own communist party and allowed power to shift to the constituent governments of the Soviet bloc.
